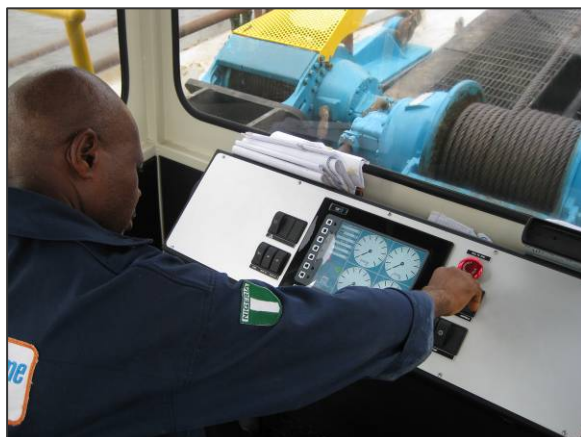
**DSC DELIVERS SHARK DREDGE TO PORT HARCOURT, NIGERIA  
NEW DREDGE WILL ENHANCE NIGERIAN CONTRACTOR'S FLEET**

**RESERVE, LA (June 2, 2009)** – Dredging Supply Company, Inc. (DSC) recently delivered an 18" x 18" Shark class dredge to Nigerian customer Japaul Oil and Maritime Services PLC. The dredge was delivered and commissioned by DSC field service engineers in Lagos, Nigeria last month.

Japaul Oil and Maritime Services PLC (Japaul) is a rising star in the Nigerian dredging industry. Over the past several years, foreign dredging contractors have been replaced with Nigerian contractors who have been busy updating their dredge fleets. Jegede A. Paul, Managing Director/CEO, already owns dredges from Korea and Holland, and took delivery of his first DSC Shark (an 18" x



16" configuration) two years ago. Although the unit was used, DSC provides OEM parts information to all customers as an added benefit and Mr. Paul was able to purchase spare parts from local shops in Nigeria.



Seeing the outstanding service and production of a pre-owned DSC dredge, Mr. Paul ordered a new 18" x 18" Shark Class dredge with 17m (56 feet) digging depth capability. The new unit was recently delivered and will be used in various contract projects throughout the country. This dredge features an electronic Caterpillar 3412-E engine on an 18" dredge pump and has a Caterpillar C-11 driving the hydraulic system. The computer on the Caterpillar engine "talks" to the dredge PLC computer controls, which are standard on all DSC

Sharks. The communication results in fuel savings and less wear and tear on the dredge, ensuring a more efficient operation. After only two days of training on the new dredge controls, the Japaul crew was pumping a full pipeline of coarse Nigerian sharp river sand a distance of 800 meters. The pile of sand grew so fast they had to get a second bulldozer onsite to keep up with the dredge production.

Both DSC dredges were financed using the US Ex-Im Bank loan guarantee program. Japaul used a Nigerian bank to issue a guarantee to M&T Bank in Baltimore, who provided the 5-year loan with guarantee from the US Government.

"I want to work with the best companies and I have found the best dredge manufacturer, DSC" said Mr. Jegede Paul. "The equipment is rugged and sophisticated yet simple and very easy to learn, and the production has exceeded our expectations". "I am updating my dredge fleet with new DSC dredges".
